## THE TORINO PROCESS

The Torino Process is

a **participatory process**

leading to an **evidence-based analysis of VET policies** in a given country.

## PURPOSE

To **build consensus** on the possible ways forward in VET policy and system development:

- **determining the state of the art and vision** for VET development in the country

AND

- after a certain period, an **assessment** of whether countries are achieving the results they want

## FOUR PRINCIPLES

- **ownership** of both process and results
- broad **participation** in the process as basis for reflections and consensus-building/ **policy learning**
- **holistic approach** incl. links to economic & social demands
- **evidence or knowledge-based** assessment

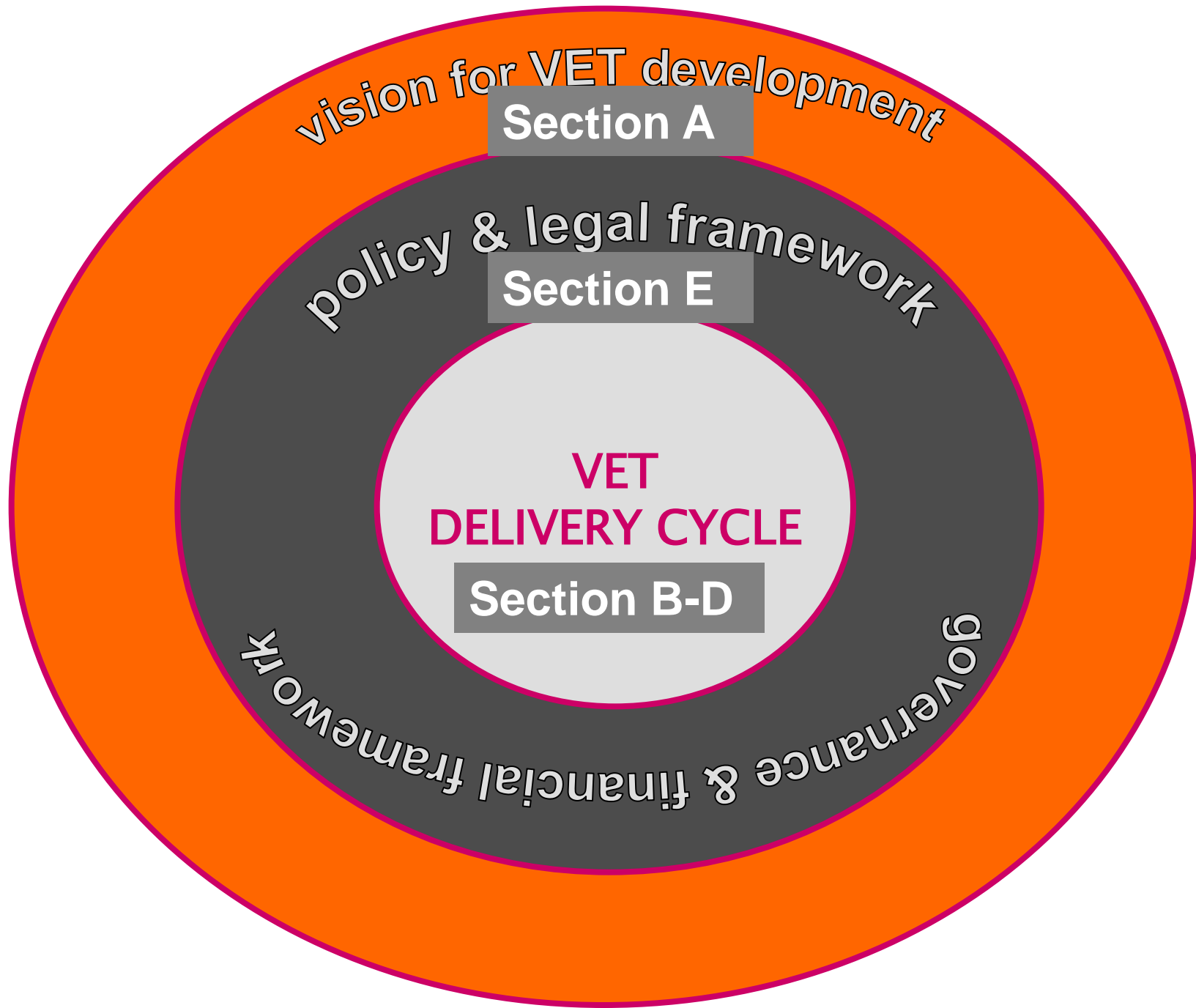
